

From Your Pastor

This is the first of three years of National Eucharistic Renewal for Dioceses in the

United States. In this spirit I share with you some excerpts from an article on Holy Communion written by Fr. Ronald Rolheiser who is a prolific writer on Catholic Christian spirituality. "Being fed with the bread of life is one of the meanings of the Eucharist; we are meant to receive this food from heaven frequently to sustain us on our own journey. Being nourished by the Eucharist means more than receiving communion at Mass. The bread of life is meant to feed us in other ways. We aren't just called to receive the Eucharist in church. We are called to be a Eucharistic people. The Body of Christ comprises three realities: the person of Jesus, the Eucharist, and the body of believers. And this latter component, the body of believers, which is us, is just as real and just as physical as is the person of Jesus and the Eucharistic species. St. Paul tells us that we 'are' the Body of Christ...Paul affirms clearly the we 'are' Christ's body, as real and as physical as is the historical Body of Jesus. So we too, the Christian community, are the Bread of Life. At the Eucharist, then, it is not just bread and wine that are transubstantiated; so too is the congregation. When the priest pronounces the words of consecration, he is not just asking God to turn bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ; he is asking that the congregation be turned into the Body of Christ....And so the bread of life comes to us in various ways. Jesus nourishes us whenever we pray to him; the Eucharist feeds us with the bread of life whenever we partake of it; and the community of the faithful also functions as Eucharist. The love, friendship, support and care we give to others and receive from others is also communion." St. Thomas Aguinas, one of the Fathers of the Church, said that when we withhold a compliment from someone who deserves it, it is a sin because we are withholding food which that person needs to live on.

Planning One's Funeral in the Catholic Church: Later this month and into the early part of November, we will be offering a program called "Journeying from Death to Eternal Life - Planning for the Day when God calls you home." This three-week program - October 25th, November 1st and November 8th - will focus on the Catechesis and Spirituality of Death and Eternal Life, Funeral Planning with a Funeral Home and Planning your Funeral Liturgy with your parish church. From the dates listed above these presentations will be held on Tuesdays from 1:00-2:15 P.M. in the church hall. They will also be recorded on our website to replay at a later time if you cannot attend these afternoon sessions in person.

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember our beloved dead. As in past years our parish will be extending an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past year to gather for a special Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, November 5th, at 9:30 A.M. Letters of invitation are being mailed out to those families. The Mass is open for parishioners to attend as well. The Mass will also be live-streamed that Saturday morning. We invite you to either attend this Mass or to view it live-streamed at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead. Since this Mass is just a little more than three weeks away, please make a note of it.

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

The election of Pope Francis in March 2013 set off an immediate media frenzy to determine the biographical details of the new pope: who Jorge Maria Bergoglio was, what he stood for, and from whence he had come. In these excerpts (Part IV) from a James Martin essay that appeared in the March 23, 2013 issue of The Tablet, he provides an introduction to some of the basic principles of Ignatian spirituality. "Secondly, the Jesuit aims to be the 'contemplative in action,' a person in a busy world with a listening heart. That characteristic came to the fore in the first few minutes of Pope Francis' papacy. When Francis stepped on to the balcony overlooking St. Peter's Square, he began not with a papal blessing, but with a request for the prayers of the people. He bowed his head and asked for a moment of silent prayer. Quiet in the midst of the crowd: the contemplative in action."



So many attended a listening and gathering session, reached out to speak with a committee member, submitted your responses in writing, or attended a ministry group to share your thoughts on the 2023 Synod topics. Thank you to the parishioners who assisted members of the Spiritual Growth team in taking notes, preparing various summaries and for the many prayers. The Parish report compiled by the Spiritual Growth Committee was presented in its entirety, to Father Richard Reidy, Vicar General, Worcester Diocese and to the Pastoral Council here at Saint George Church.

The results from all participating parishes within the Worcester Diocese have now been compiled into a document entitled 2022 Synthesis of Synodal Experience. Visit worcesterdiocese.org/synod-2023-home to access a copy of this document online. The USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) has compiled all diocesan reports. You can access all Regional and National level Synthesis reports at usccb.org/synod. Moving forward the United States and Canada will collaborate on a final document to comprise a Continental Synthesis due in March 2023. This foundation will then move to the Universal stage in October 2023. After reading these reports I remain thankful, encouraged, and hopeful. The hopes, dreams, and disappointments you shared are now further validated, merged and reverberating with those of others throughout this diocese and beyond.
