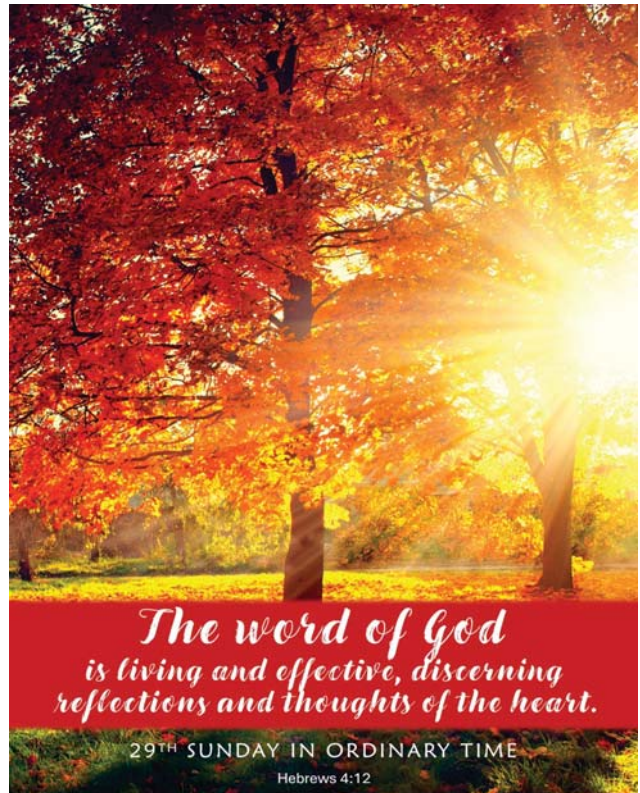

From Your Pastor

In today's on demand world of instant gratification, we are used to getting things that we want instantly. If we have a question we can instantly get the answer by googling the question. The days of watching a program while being aired on prime time are over. We can simply record multiple programs at the same time to preview later. We can receive mail from across the country the next day. Instead of dieting or exercising to lose weight, we can have liposuction done. It goes on and on.

When it comes to God, there are no quick and easy approaches. Our God is not an on demand God. When we communicate with him, we are heard instantly but may not get the response we desire right away. This can frustrate some people who lose interest when they do not see the response they want quickly. Persistence pays off when one realizes that this is done over time. Praying persistently and not giving up when results do not come instantly is what today's gospel is about. We must not give up on our prayers. We must pray often and persistently.

Here are some questions to reflect upon with this Gospel:

1. How faithfully do you pray? What do you pray for? How do you react when God does not answer your prayer when you think he should?
2. What has been your experience of God's answering your prayers? How do you understand Jesus' promise that God responds quickly?

Mass of Thanksgiving – Fr. Julio Granados: Because Fr. Julio Granados had to return to his native Colombia immediately after his ordination in June, we had to wait until later to schedule a Mass of Thanksgiving for him. So, on Sunday, October 30th, at 10:00 A.M. Fr. Julio will celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving here in our church followed by a reception in the church hall. All are welcome to attend both the Mass and reception.

Planning One's Funeral in the Catholic Church: Later this month and into the early part of November, we will be offering a program called "Journeying from Death to Eternal Life – Planning for the Day when God calls you home." This three-week program – October 25th, November 1st and November 8th – will focus on the Catechesis and Spirituality of Death and Eternal Life, Funeral Planning with a Funeral Home and Planning your Funeral Liturgy with your parish church. From the dates listed above these presentations will be held on Tuesdays from 1:00-2:15 P.M. in the church hall. They will also be recorded on our website to replay at a later time if you cannot attend these afternoon sessions in person.

In November we will be observing the month of All Souls when we remember our beloved dead. As in past years our parish will be extending an invitation to the families of those parishioners who had died during the past year to gather for a special Mass of Remembrance on Saturday, November 5th, at 9:30 A.M. Letters of invitation are being mailed out to those families. The Mass is open for parishioners to attend as well. The Mass will also be live-streamed that Saturday morning. We invite you to either attend this Mass or to view it live-streamed at this date and time to remember these deceased parishioners and all of our beloved dead.

James Martin Speaks to us through his "Essential Writings"

The election of Pope Francis in March 2013 set off an immediate media frenzy to determine the biographical details of the new pope: who Jorge Maria Bergoglio was, what he stood for, and from whence he had come. In these excerpts (Part V) from a James Martin essay that appeared in the March 23, 2013 issue of The Tablet, he provides an introduction to some of the basic principles of Ignatian spirituality. "Thirdly, poverty. Like members of all religious orders, Jesuits make a vow of poverty... We are, said St. Ignatius, to love poverty 'as a mother.' There are three reasons for that: first, in imitation of Jesus who himself lived as a poor man; secondly, to free ourselves from the need for possessions; and thirdly, to identify with (as well as help and advocate for) the materially poor. Pope Francis has so far eschewed many trappings of the papacy. Before stepping on to that balcony, he set aside the elaborate mozzetta that popes normally wear, and put on the Brocaded stole only when he offered a blessing. He rides on the bus with the rest of the cardinals. He walks rather than taking a limousine. Most Jesuits seeing this would say: 'Of course, the simple lifestyle that Ignatius asks of us.'" (NOTE) This article was written in March of 2013 before Pope Francis was beset with several physical ailments.)

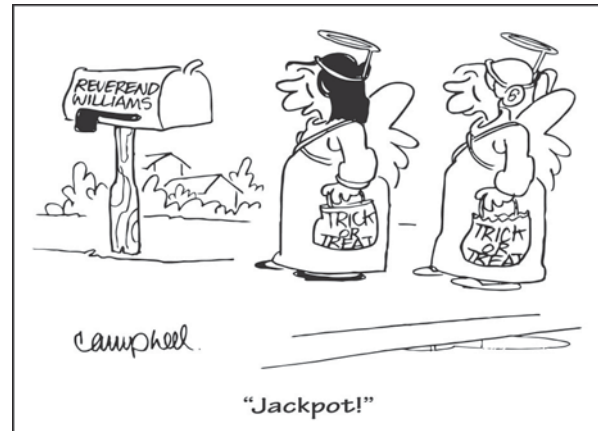

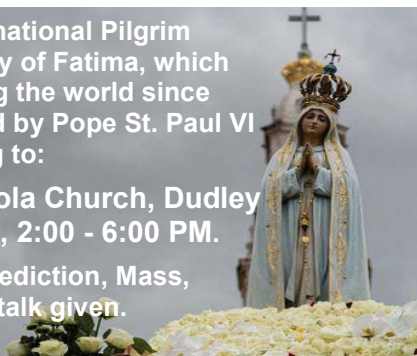

Saint Francis of Assisi - Feast Day October 4
Our church is one of many area churches to honor the spirit of Saint Francis of Assisi, by holding a "Blessing of the animals" event in October. What can the Patron Saint of animals, ecology and merchants teach of glory? Born more than eight centuries ago to wealth and privilege Giovanni di Pietro di Bernardone wanted for little in his early years. He was well liked, happy, and a born leader. As such any faults he had were quickly overlooked. In young adulthood the privileges he exercised with joy and ease led him to gather with bold, spirited groups and to a lifestyle of sin and excess. He thought life as a soldier would bring him Glory. Instead, while many soldiers died, he was held in a dungeon. After a period of captivity, his family was able to pay his way free. On his second foray as a soldier, he made it but one day, before hearing God tell him to "return home". Humbled and reviled at all that he had been, Francis sought conversion. He began to carry out Gods word but in a very literal sense. Taking the very clothes from his back to share with the poor. When Francis heard God speak again, he took from his father to gain money to "repair the church". His Father wanting Francis to follow him in business, did not want him to become "a man of God", would disown him. Francis began to live in poverty, accepting simplicity and sharing love and commitment to the poor. He began to preach, his followers became like a brotherhood, their poor joyful nature at first a spectacle became accepted over time. It is reported Francis preached as hundreds of birds gathered around him. Even to the animals Francis offered his brotherhood as he shared love and praise for God the Creator. Naturally Francis is attributed with holding the first live Christmas Nativity. Living in poverty and outdoors, exposed to the elements would lead Francis to become ill and eventually blind. He would continue to praise Gods beauty in all things until his death. Saint Francis did not find glory in the thing's wealth brought or in war. A repentant Saint Francis, choosing to live in poverty, in brotherhood and love for all, praising Gods works and sharing the Gospel, Francis surely was bound for Eternal Glory.
