

From Your Pastor

LENTEN QUIET EVENING: On Tuesday evening, April 5th, from 6:30-8:00 P.M. we will have a Lenten evening of prayer & reflection in church. This will be an opportunity to go to confession and receive

the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We encourage you to take this opportunity to do so.

With Palm Sunday only one week away, we will turn our eyes and open our hearts to contemplate the heart of our faith: Christ died and rose again in glory so that we could know the fullness of his love now and forever. God's incomprehensible love for us entered into the world as a tiny, vulnerable infant and grew into a man who fearlessly, humbly and selflessly accepted God's plan for him. Jesus let himself be sacrificed. His bloody sacrifice was necessary to atone for all sin by his death. Jesus introduced the New Covenant that focused on relationships with God through faith and repentance.

It is difficult to hear the story of what Jesus endured or even to imagine the pain and degradation that he felt. The Gospel of Luke shows the violence of Jesus' ordeal by using such words as contemptuous, sneered, jeered, flogged and crucified. The adoring crowd who proclaimed him king when he entered Jerusalem because of the miracles he performed and the healing he provided became the raucous, spitting crowd who screamed crucify him! and insulted him as he dragged himself to Calvary.

Jesus' courage and resolve are more than heroic. for he knows who he is and what his mission is. He is God made man to show us the depth of God's love for humanity. His enduring gift to us of his body and blood at weekly Mass is the way we keep Jesus alive within us. His presence is always within us not only reminding us of the pain and suffering that he endured to save our souls, but also reminding us of his unconditional love for God and for God's children. When he saved us, he did so with quiet dignity and devotion to God. God does not ask of that kind of devotion from us because Jesus offered it for us. What God asks of us is to have faith in him and to sincerely repent for the sins we commit. By remembering Jesus at Mass and partaking of the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist we keep Jesus within our cleansed hearts and we honor God by doing what he asks of us. Jesus' sacrifice of himself in this ultimate act of love shows us that nothing is greater than the love of God our Father. In his suffering and sacrifice, Jesus shows us that the ultimate act of love is forgiveness. Fr. Niccolls

We are pleased to tell you that this year's Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday) will look very much like our pre-COVID Triduum liturgies. Among other things, that means that we are back on Palm Sunday to a distribution and blessing of palms (in church – not in the parking lot). We are back on Thursday to the washing of the feet and a procession of the Eucharist to a separate repository. We are back on Friday to inperson Stations of the Cross at 3 pm and a Veneration of the Cross on Friday evening (with a bow – not a kiss). We are back at the Easter Vigil to an Easter fire at the front door, hand-held candles for the congregation, a chanted Exultet and bottles of Easter water distributed to the people. It feels like a Resurrection. Join us to partake in all of this sacred symbolization that captures our Christian faith.

Why the Ancient Traditions of Prayer, Fasting & Almsgiving during Lent? In preparation for the great celebration of Easter, we are called to pray, fast and give alms as some of the ways to help us draw closer to God during Lent.

<u>Prayer</u> is one of the ways to connect with God , in silence, in words, and in worship. Jesus prayed constantly and taught us to pray to Our Father in heaven. Jesus emphasized that our prayer need not be long, complicated or showy, but rather, short, to the point, and heartfelt.

<u>Fasting</u> on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, (taking only one full meal) reminds us of our dependence on God. We "do not live on bread alone."

On the Fridays of Lent we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence from meat. These are acts of self-discipline and self-control which can help to keep us mindful of God's loving presence.

Almsgiving; Lent invites us to see the face of Christ in the hungry and homeless, sick and suffering. Jesus depends on us to listen with compassion to the joys and sorrows of our friends and family members and to reach out in kindness and compassion to all.
