

From Your Pastor

As the occasion presents itself, it is good to mention once again a formation process that is very important in the life of the Church – the Rite of Christian Ini-

tiation of Adults or RCIA as it is more commonly known. This process is available to adults who have never been baptized or to those who have been baptized but were never instructed or catechized after baptism. There are several stages of preparation in this process that help a person become a full-fledged member of the Catholic Church.

- 1. One begins with the precatechumenate where (s)he has some spiritual conversation about God and the Church.
- 2. Then the rite of acceptance into the order of catechumens is celebrated where the person is considered a member of the Church in a broad sense. During this time one becomes familiar with what the Church teaches, follows the Christian way of life and engages in liturgical prayer. This formation period concludes with the rite of election when the Church, in the name of the local bishop calls the catechumen to the eventual reception of the sacraments of initiation Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This rite of election takes place on the First Sunday of Lent.
- 3. During the Lenten season, one continues in a period purification and enlightenment in order to spiritually prepare to celebrate the sacraments of initiation.
- 4. At the conclusion of the Lenten season during the Easter Vigil the person receives the sacraments of initiation.
- 5. After receiving these sacraments one enters into a period called mystagogy that usually coincides with the 50 days of the Easter season. This time in one of deepening the new Catholic Christian's participation in their new faith community of the Church by meditating, praying, worshipping and doing works of charity. This period of mystagogy prepares the person for a lifelong relationship in his/her new faith life and emphasizes the importance of remaining close to the faith community of the Church to which (s)he now belongs.

Henri Nouwen Speaks to us through his Letters
Henri Nouwen died on September 21, 1996. His
death was sudden and unexpected. In this final installment of this series of articles, I share Henri's reflections on Rembrandt's Return of the Prodigal Son,
a reproduction of which hangs on the wall of St.
George church. Henri wrote a book of the same title.
I encourage you to read his book and to spend time
in prayer before Rembrandt's painting.

"When I went to St. Petersburg to see Rembrandt's Return of the Prodigal Son, I had little idea how much I would have to live what I then saw. I stand with awe at the place Rembrandt brought me. He led me from the kneeling disheveled young son to the standing, bent-over father, from the place of being blessed to the place of blessing. As I look at my own aging hands, I know that they have been given to me to stretch out towards all who suffer, to rest upon the shoulders of all who come, and to offer the blessing that emerges from the immensity of God's love."

Nature Inspires Prayer

Blooming trees and bushes, the brown winter grass becoming a lush green, the songs of birds filling the air-all are welcome signs of new life and the revival of Spring, so long awaited -particularly this year. Our bodies, our hearts and our souls respond in various ways. More physical movement is possible, gathering with friends and families warms our hearts, and in our souls we say, "Thank you God for the beauty that surrounds us."

Nature throughout the year, in its many changing forms often leads us to a sense of awe felt so deeply. The poet, Mary Oliver, puts it so beautifully when she writes, "Sometimes I need only to stand wherever I am to be blessed."


Fr. James Martin, S.J. embodies this statement as he relates the manner in which he begins each yearly retreat. He looks at the ocean, river or forest depending on the retreat house location. He feels joy, a sense of calm and is disposed to praying. He tells us that according to Celtic spirituality places that call forth awe are called "thin places"-when the border between God and humanity is thin and a closeness occurs.

It has been proven that spending time in green spaces has significant health benefits. But just as important Fr. Martin tells us are the spiritual effects. Spending time in nature connects us with God at a deep level. We are encountering something directly made by God. Mary Oliver tells us, "To pay attention, this is our endless and proper work."

Perhaps we can relate to the Celtic idea of "thin places". On a personal level one of my "thin places" is the ocean. There I find peace and a sense of awe as I gaze at the immensity, the color, the tides and the life within. Although prayer comes easily at the ocean's edge, there are also times when I say nothing-just experiencing with awe. This too is a form of prayer. Fr. William A. Barry, S.J. indicates this when he writes, "You can be praying by consciously sensing what God has made."

We all have places which lead us to prayer and awe. Using the Celtic terminology "thin places" we can ask ourselves:

Where are my "thin places"?
Do these places lead me to prayer and a deepening relationship with God?
